We had a successful hockey season with an increase of registrants for the 2024-2025 season.

- There was an increase of 4 teams in Community hockey, House League remained the same at 4 teams.
- Community players increased by 125 players
- U7 Jr increased by 7 players
- U7 Sr increased by 32 players
- U9 decreased by 14 players
- U11 increased by 19 players
- U13 increased by 49 players
- U15 increased by 19 players
- U18 increased by 13 players
- House League numbers remained the same with many people on the waitlist

The Pathways ice times were well attended this year and provided players (and coaches) a great opportunity to condition themselves in time for evaluations and the beginning of a long hockey season. These ice times are of great value, especially to those who couldn't take part in any summer hockey camps. I continue to support these ice times and encourage others to make them a priority. There were plenty of technical challenges encountered during the skills sessions in 2024. Although we were unable to be use the data from these sessions for placements into Cascade groupings, I was proud of the efforts that were made to get us through a long day as best as we could, given the unforeseen circumstances. The lessons learned from these sessions will be invaluable going forward, both personally and from a Society perspective.

As we progressed into the cascades and scrimmages, I was very fortunate to have a experienced group of volunteer evaluators, and we rarely encountered issues with the quality or quantity of evaluators at each session. I would encourage all prospective coaches to attend at least one cascade and scrimmage session in September.

#### **Evaluations**

As a result of some laser issue with the younger age groups it was decided that skills sessions would be cancelled for the U18 age group and player were placed into groups for cascades to begin the evaluation process. Once again, the pathways skates and evaluation process went relatively smoothly this year thanks to the tremendous work and countless hours put in by the age group volunteers and BVHS Coaches. The time and effort displayed by this group is the key to the process running smooth and efficient.

This group of volunteer leaders, in conjunction with the hard working and detailed orientated evaluator volunteers, ensured that all our U18 players were placed in divisions in which they could reach their full potential.

#### **Teams**

This season BV had a total of 9 team in the U18 age group this season - 4 team in our body contact divisions and 5 non-contact teams.

Several teams were successful in taking home hardware in tournaments, making it to the finals in Esso Minor Hockey Week and making it deep into cities!

#### Summary

Highlights of the year were watching our teams compete in Esso Minor Hockey week and cities. This year we moved the graduation banquet and volunteer awards to the Deerfoot Inn and Casino. It was a great night and was wonderful seeing all the coaches present the jerseys to their graduating players. Players who completed the final season of their minor hockey career were all awarded BV jerseys and it was wonderful to see all their non-graduating teammates come out to support.

I wish all the best to all our U18 players and families and look forward to seeing many of you back at the rink in the fall.

### **Director of Goaltending Report**

- Oversee and facilitate goaltender evaluation process for 4 age groups (U11/U13/U15/U18)
  - Approximately 150 hours between late August and the end of September
- Coordinate with contracted goalie consultants and goalie age group coordinators
- Facilitate and run goaltender clinics/goalie coach clinics with Goalie Mentor throughout the hockey season.
- Conduct pre-evaluation goalie parent meeting and presentation.
- Liaise with goalie parents throughout hockey season as required.
- Assist with team-specific goalie coaching upon request.
- Work with BV Manager of Hockey Operations to refine goaltender evaluation and goalie/goalie coach development processes year over year.
- Monthly participation in BVHS Board of Director meetings

#### Highlights for 2023/2024 season

- Conducted the 9th annual goalie parent meeting and presentation virtually with Trevor, prior to evaluations. It was well attended, and we had great questions asked
- This was the fourth year of the hybrid goalie process; we had no hybrids this year
- The evaluation process was coordinated with the assistance of Brian Axelson, Ryan Nahorniak, Ryan Calmusky and Mike West. Communication with parents in each age group was timely and appreciated.
- World Pro Goaltending provided consulting services for the first 2 goaltender only evaluation sessions (to establish preliminary rankings) and throughout the goaltender evaluation process.
- We had good dialogue and evaluators for goaltenders this year, not always but usually 3-5 former goalies were evaluating so it was nice to have evaluators with understanding of the position
- We facilitated 5 goalie clinics during the season. These were held monthly in October, November, December, January and February.
- The goalie clinics went well, the first clinic we had a net issue but it was corrected in the next sessions. We staffed 8 former or current Bow Valley alum goalies as coaches, as well as 7 current or former players as shooters. This trained the Flames to gain experience working with kids, leadership and to take their knowledge and pass it on to the next generation of Bow Valley
- BVHS was able to offer and cover the cost of a goaltender coaching program for one coach per team through Goalie Development Inc. (GDI)
  - Helped teams with equipment issues and general questions through out the year.





- Lasers went well, We helped train multiple Flames on how to run the iPad and lasers giving them an opportunity to gain work experience and give back to their Hockey community.
- Did 72 Practices with Bow valley teams and attended 13 games, Took video of goalies teaching how to analyze film and use it as a tool to spot what is going wrong.
- 78 goalies were registered prior to the evaluation process, up from 69 in the prior year. Due to buffs and hybrid shake ups we ended with a total of 63 goalies. Below are the number, the bracketed number was the amount of goalies after evaluations

o U11 – 29 (25) o U13 – 19 (15) o U15 – 18 (15) o U18 – 12 (8)

10 of the 78 goalies registered were selected by the CBHA at various levels.


From a financial point of view, the 2024/2025 year has been a successful one. We remain in a strong financial position which allows BVHS to continue to offer different initiatives aimed at enhancing the experience for all members and players. In addition, this strong financial position allows BVHS to keep fee increases to a minimum and provides the financial capacity to capitalize on future investment opportunities that may arise.

Over the 2024/2025 year we continued to implement appropriate internal controls working with both the Board of Directors and the External Auditors, and we will continue to modify and refine the control environment through 2025/2026.

Increased revenues over the year driven primarily by increased registration numbers as well as expanded tournament offerings:

- o Registration fees up 10.6%
- o Tournament fees up 29.8%

The small losses seen in 2023/2024, and anticipated again in 2024/2025 were budgeted in an effort to keep fees affordable for the membership. I would anticipate that the 2024/2025 loss will be similar to the previous year, at approximately \$20K. These losses do not have a material impact on our financial strength and viability.
