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REGISTRATION & FEES

When and how can I register?

Registration for the upcoming season opens June 15/26. If you register after July 31/26, a late fee of \$200 will automatically be applied to the U9-U18 regular registration fees. You can register [here](#).

What communities are within the BVHS boundaries?

Players must be permanent residents of the communities of Auburn Bay, Cranston, Mahogany, McKenzie Lake, Seton and Rangeview. Players must live in these communities with a parent or guardian OR having a release from their assigned association and Hockey Calgary.

******Any new member who resides in the McKenzie Lake community will now need to register with the Wolverines.**

What information does BVHS need prior to registering?

BVHS will need proof of age and proof of residency. **Before you complete any of the forms before, you will need to be sure to have a valid Shift Forward Badge.**

- [New Member Pre-Registration \(Never Played Hockey Before\)](#) – you will need your Shift Forward – Parent Badge Number, 1 PDF file of a birth certificate or passport for proof of age, as well as 1 PDF file with 2 acceptable proof of residency.
- [New Player in the Family \(Never Played Hockey Before\)](#) – you will need your Shift Forward – Parent Badge Number (add this member to your profile), 1 PDF file of a birth certificate or passport for proof of age, as well as 1 PDF file with 2 acceptable proof of residency.
- [Transfer from Another Association \(Have Played Hockey Before\)](#) – you will need your Shift Forward – Parent Badge Number, 1 PDF file of a birth certificate or passport for proof of age, as well as 1 PDF file with 4 acceptable proof of residency. You will also need to complete the [Parent Declaration Form](#).



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What forms of payment does BVHS accept?

Credit card is the ONLY payment option Bow Valley Hockey Society can accept

Do you offer a payment plan?

Yes, credit card installment plans will be available at the time of registration.

The payment plan allows you to make 3 equal payments with 1/3 of cost at the time of registration, 1/3 on July 15 and the remaining 1/3 on August 15. All fees must be paid in full by September 1st.

There are no exceptions to this date.

What forms of payment does BVHS accept?

Credit card is the ONLY payment option Bow Valley Hockey Society can accept.

Where can I get a receipt?

To generate or view your registration receipt in TeamLinkt, follow these steps using a web browser (note: this feature is not available in the mobile app):

1. Log in to your TeamLinkt account at app.teamlinkt.com.
2. Select your "Profile" from the menu. (typically bottom left corner)
3. Click on "My Family".
4. Choose the registered participant for whom you want the receipt.
5. Select the relevant season.
6. Click on "View Invoice". You may need to scroll horizontally to see the list of invoices.

If you need a printed copy, you can use your browser's print function to print the invoice or save it as a PDF for your records.

What is the withdrawal procedure?

The first step is to notify the Manager of Hockey Operations - mho@bvhs.ca and the BVHS registrar - roula@bvhs.ca by e-mail of the desire to withdraw the registration. Once this notification is received, BVHS will notify Hockey Calgary, and the registration will be cancelled.

Effective immediately the member is no longer permitted to participate in any future BVHS ice times or activities, NO exceptions. The BVHS registrar will notify once the withdrawal process has been completed with Hockey Calgary. Once a player has withdrawn, they are not permitted to register again until the following season. This is known as the "waiting period". If there are unique circumstances, BVHS may choose to waive this waiting period requirement depending on the time of year and direction from Hockey Calgary.

There will be a minimum \$200.00 per player withdrawal administration fee (this will apply to all registrations except those players who are selected for a CBHA team. More information is available on the BVHS website regarding the [Withdrawal & Refund Policy](#). Please note, the late fee will not be reimbursed.



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What is the BVHS refund policy?

BVHS's structure for its refund policy is as follows:

- Any refund prior to the first evaluation for that specific age group will get a full refund minus a \$200.00 administration fee. Notice of withdrawal must be received 24 hours prior to their scheduled ice time.
- No refunds will be given once the age group has started evaluations. (Community)
- No refunds will be given once an age group has started balancing teams. (House League)

The only exception for refunds is due to injuries and/or transfers for work and those situations will be decided upon by the BVHS Executive and MHO.

Any player receiving a season-ending injury prior to February 1 will receive a pro-rated refund for the duration of hockey missed from the time of injury. A doctor's note stating the injury is season-ending must be provided for a pro-rated refund before February 1.

Any player injured after February 1 will not be issued a pro-rated refund regardless if it's a season-ending injury. Players that are injured and miss any duration of time throughout the season but return to hockey in the same season will not be given a pro-rated refund for the time missed. Society Volunteer hours must still be fulfilled.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

How can I apply for financial assistance?

There are programs available to assist families with the financial cost of registration. You must apply and qualify for these programs. Once you are approved for financial assistance, Bow Valley will refund the amount you qualified for. All financial assistance applications are completed online.

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HOCKEY CANADA REGISTRATION NUMBER (HCR) & THE SHIFT FORWARD PROGRAM

How do I get an HCR number?

HCR (Hockey Canada Registry) ID number is obtained by creating a Spordle account. Please [click here](#) for step-by-step instructions on creating an HCR account for yourself then creating HCR number for your child.

Where do I go to take the Shift Forward parent course?

The Shift Forward for Hockey Canada Parents – to get started, [click here](#).

I have taken the Shift Forward program for another sport. Do I have to take it again?

Hockey Alberta requires that the course be taken every 4 years. If you have taken the course in the past 4 years, you will need to login into your [Spordle](#) account and add it to your profile.

How do I see if I have taken the Shift Forward course, or to see when I last took it?

Log into your *spordle account*, if you see the certification there then you have already completed it. Check the completion date as it expires after 3 years.

I have taken the Shift Forward program for another one of my players that is already playing in BVHS. Do I have to take the course again?

You do not have to retake the course. Ensure you link the course to your player's profile using their HCR number.

If I have the Shift Forward - Parent, do I also need to take the Shift Forward Coach/Team Official course if I would like to coach?

Yes, the two courses are not the same. The Shift Forward Coach/Team Officials program needs to be done for everyone that would like be a Head Coach or Assistant Coach.

Is there a fee associated with this course?

Yes, parents must pay for the Shift Forward Parent Program.

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AGE GROUP AND BIRTH YEARS

Jr Flames 2022 and 2023 Birth Years: Registration Fee: \$500 + Fees

The Jr Flames Learn To Play Program is designed for kids aged 3 and 4. This program provides an outlet for beginner players to gain an insight into the game of hockey. BVHS coaches will teach these young players the FUNdamentals of the game through station-based activities and small area games. During each ice session our instructors will focus on a variety of skill sets including forward and backward skating, basic balance, skating, turning, puck control, passing and shooting.

For the three-year-olds, we do encourage that a parent comes on ice to assist with their child. Players need to be able to get up and down on their own without assistance and they should be able to shuffle across the ice without assistance prior to registering for this program.

The Jr Flames program consists of 15 ice times with set schedules administered by paid on ice coaches along with parent support on ice.

Timbits Age Group 2020 and 2021 Birth Years: Registration Fee: \$950 + Fees

Effective for the 2019-20 season and beyond, U7 and U9 hockey in Alberta will run under the title Intro to Hockey. [Please visit the Intro to Hockey Guidelines document for more information.](#) Visit the U7 frequently asked questions for more information regarding U7 (Timbits) Hockey.

- Teach the basic skills of hockey so players can enjoy the game,

- Deliver a program that is age appropriate for the size, skill and age of the players,
- Encourage the aspects of fitness, fair play and co-operation while having fun playing the game.

Jr. Timbits – Generally 1st Year Players

- Game Maximum for U7 Jr. Timbits is 16 'formal-modified' games up until Feb 23 and 20 total 'formal-modified' games from Sept-March.
- This includes 8 Hockey Calgary scheduled games, and any additional exhibition and tournament games. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Tournament /Jamboree Maximum for U7 Jr. Timbits 2 (HC Jamboree Excluded)
- Only 1 Tournament/Jamboree can be out-of-town**



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Sr. Timbits – Generally 2nd Year Players

- Informal games until November 15th
- Game Maximum for U7 Sr. Timbits is 18 'formal-modified' games up until Feb 23 and 24 total 'formal-modified' games from Sept-March.
- This includes 8 Hockey Calgary scheduled games, and any additional exhibition and tournament games. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Tournament /Jamboree Maximum for U7 Sr. Timbits 3 (HC Jamboree Excluded)
- Only 1 Tournament/Jamboree can be out-of-town**

U9 Age Group 2018 and 2019 Birth Years: Registration Fee: \$1380 + Fees

Effective for the 2019-20 season and beyond, U7 and U9 hockey in Alberta will run under the title Intro to Hockey. [Please visit the Intro to Hockey Guidelines document for more information.](#)

The goals and objectives of Intro to Hockey programming are to:

- Teach the basic skills of hockey so players can enjoy the game,
- Assist in the development and enhancement of physical literacy and basic motor patterns
- Deliver a program that is age appropriate for the size, skill and age of the players,
- Encourage the aspects of fitness, fair play and co-operation while having fun playing the game.

U9 Seasonal Structure

- Game Maximum for U9 is 28 Games up until Feb 23, and 35 total games from Sept-Mar.
- 6 Seeding (HC Scheduled)
- 10 Regular Season (HC Scheduled)
- 2 EMHW (HC Scheduled)
- 3 Tournament/Jamboree Maximum (approx. 9-12 games)
- Exhibition Games (approx. 2 games)
- Tournament/Jamboree Maximum for U9 is 3 Tour./Jamb (Only 2 Tournaments/Jamborees can be out-of-town)
- Out-of-Town is defined as any rink outside of the Hockey Calgary Boundaries and the 16 additional



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rinks identified to be in close proximity to Calgary. The reason for this limit is to help reduce the incremental costs associated with traveling to tournaments (hotels, food, gas, etc.) No tournament participation prior to end of seeding round (Nov 18).

Hockey Calgary will be allowing full ice games during the 2026 - 2027 Season. More information will be shared once the details have been confirmed.

U11 Age Group 2016 and 2017 Birth Years: Registration Fee: \$1450 + Fees

The Game Maximum for U11 is 45 Games. The game count does NOT include Esso Minor Hockey Week (except game 1 of EMHW) and playoff games.

- 6 Games Seeding (HC Scheduled). U11 AA teams will also play 6 games during the seeding round. However, these 6 games will be regular season games and count to the regular season standings because there is no team movement in or out of the AA League.
- 12 Games Regular Season (HC Scheduled)
- EMHW (1 game). The first game in EMHW is Regular Season game and is counted in the 12 game Regular Season total.
- Exhibition Games (approximately 4 – 11 games, booked at team's discretion)
- Tournament Games (approximately 12 – 16 games, booked at team's discretion)
- Approximately 37 half Ice and 3 full Ice Practices. U11 AA – 40 half ice and 15 full ice practices.

U13 Age Group 2014 and 2015 Birth Years: Registration Fee: \$1500 + Fees

There is no maximum game limit for the U13, U15, and U18 age categories. However, Hockey Calgary suggests a schedule between 40-50 games in total.

- 8 Games Seeding (HC Scheduled)
- 12 Games Regular Season (HC Scheduled)
- 24 half ice practices and 16 full ice practices
- U13 AA – approximately 40-55 full ice practices
- EMHW (1 game). The first game in EMHW is Regular Season game and is counted in the 12 game Regular Season total.
- Exhibition Games (approximately 4 – 11 games, booked at team's discretion)
- Tournament Games (approximately 12 – 16 games, booked at team's discretion)

U15 Age Group 2012 and 2013 Birth Years: Registration Fee: \$1575 + Fees

- 8 Games Seeding (HC Scheduled)
- 16 Games Regular Season (HC Scheduled)
- 10 half ice practices and 30 full ice practices
- EMHW (1 game). The first game in EMHW is Regular Season game and is counted in the 12 game Regular Season total.



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- Exhibition Games (approximately 4 – 11 games, booked at team's discretion)
 - Tournament Games (approximately 12 – 16 games, booked at team's discretion)

U18 Age Group 2009, 2010 and 2011 Birth Years: Registration Fee: \$1575 + Fees

- 8 Games Seeding (HC Scheduled)
- 14 Games Regular Season (HC Scheduled)
- 6 half ice practices and 34 full ice practices
- EMHW (1 game). The first game in EMHW is Regular Season game and is counted in the 12 game Regular Season total.
- Exhibition Games (approximately 4 – 11 games, booked at team's discretion)
- Tournament Games (approximately 12 – 16 games, booked at team's discretion)

HOUSE LEAGUE

What is House League?

The goal is to provide recreational players the opportunity to play organized hockey that is affordable, fun and safe with moderate time commitments allowing for participation in other social, academic or recreational activities. It also provides players with limited skills and knowledge an introduction to the game in a less intimidating format.

The program is regionally based, offers participants a chance to play the great game of hockey with less time and travel commitments.

NON-SANCTIONED HOCKEY

It is the responsibility of each participant to understand the Non-Sanctioned Hockey policy, as enforced by Hockey Alberta and supported by Hockey Calgary. Players or coaches who participate in a non-sanctioned hockey program while registered with Bow Valley may be subject to immediate removal from the association without refund.

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EVALUATIONS

When do evaluations usually start?

Evaluations will commence with Pathway Skates which allows the players some conditioning ice times prior to the evaluated ice time. Please [click here](#) to be directed to the Evaluations page on our website for more details about our Evaluations Policy and Procedures.

Why do I need to know my position before evaluating?

Not all divisions/evaluations are based on a player's position, but once a player starts playing U13, they do need to select a position for evaluations. At this age level, teams are selected with a specific team format and that format is determined by the number of players in each position. Once a player has started evaluations, they cannot change their position.

For the U11 Age Group, you have the option to choose to be a player, goalie or hybrid goalie.

U15 & U18 Body Checking

BVHS will be asking you during the registration process if you wish to try out for Body Checking or Non-Body Checking team. The number of teams that BVHS registers in the checking divisions will depend on the total number of players registered for U15 & U18.

Please note: If you are not successful in your evaluation for our checking teams you will be playing in a non-body checking division. Your interest in try-out for a body-checking team does not guarantee a spot on these teams. This is a great opportunity for U15 & U18 players who do not want a league with body checking but want to stay with Bow Valley Hockey Society.

Evaluation/Practice Jerseys

Two jerseys and socks will be given to all players and goalies at sock pickup night except U7(Timbits). The jersey numbers are assigned by the evaluation administrator and can't be selected by the player. BOTH jerseys must be at ALL evaluation sessions. Once teams are formed, the jerseys will be used as practice jerseys.



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My child is new to hockey, we are concerned they will not be able to keep up or have the required skill to fit in?

BVHS has programs for athletes of all skill levels. Through our evaluation process and house program, your child will play with similarly skilled athletes. It is generally recommended that they can independently stand on their skates.

Can I request that my child be on the same team as their friends?

Players registered in Community Hockey cannot request to be on the same team as a friend. Players in House League can be with a friend, but requests are not guaranteed. Requests will also need to be reciprocated. Priority is given to making teams with parity over requests.

What is a cash call?

A cash call is a predetermined amount contributed by each family at the beginning of the season. Typically ranging from \$150 to \$250, this amount helps cover early-season expenses such as tournament deposits or other initial team costs.

How much does each team need to fundraise?

Fundraising efforts are based on the team's budget, which considers factors such as the number of tournaments the team plans to participate in, desired apparel, social events, and other related expenses. Teams may choose to participate in 1 to 3 tournaments during the season, which will increase the overall fundraising needs.

ELITE (QUADRANT) HOCKEY

What age group can try out for Elite (Quadrant) Hockey?

U13, U15 & U18 players can try out for Elite Hockey (Quadrant). For BVHS, the two associations you are eligible to try out are Calgary Buffaloes Hockey Association (CBHA) or Girls Hockey Calgary (GHC) Fire. Those players who are trying out for U13AAA, U15/U18 AA/AAA teams must register with BVHS before they register with the Buffs or Fire. By filling out the registration form, you are informing us that your player will be returning to BVHS if they are released from quadrant tryouts. Please select "Elite Tryout" option on the registration for which will credit the registration fee and create a zero-dollar registration. If we do not receive your registration by August 15, 2025, registration with BVHS will be based on availability.

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If your player is unsuccessful with the elite tryouts, it is your responsibility to contact the BV registrar roula@bvhs.ca to notify them about your child returning to BVHS.

If my player gets released from Elite, are they a lock for the top team in BVHS?

When a player is released from a try-out for one of the CBHA or Calgary Fire teams, they are not a lock or guaranteed a spot on the top team with BV.

SOCIETY LEVEL VOLUNTEER BOND

What is the Society Level Volunteer Bond?

It is required that each family complete a MINIMUM of 12 hours of SOCIETY LEVEL volunteering for the 2026 - 2027 season. A \$500 commitment during the registration process will be required and anyone not fulfilling their obligations will have their \$500 Volunteer Bond per child charged by Bow Valley to the credit card used at the time of registration at the end of the season. This is mandatory to remain a BVHS member in good standing.

All BVHS members are required to volunteer for **SOCIETY LEVEL** roles and activities, or they can choose to pay out their Volunteer Bond to support BVHS' operations as a registered society. Most of the support is required in September and the beginning of October as we conduct our evaluation process. Having enough volunteers is vital in running a successful season.

SOCIETY-LEVEL volunteering includes the following list, which isn't necessarily exhaustive:

- a) Head Coach or Assistant Coach for the season - This requires a minimum of 12 hours for a single BVHS player as an evaluator or doing on-ice support for the timed skills sessions, pathways, etc.
- b) Volunteer Coordinator Role
- c) Age Group Coordinator Role
- d) Evaluation Support Shifts - Minimum 12 hours for every BVHS family. For ex: Bench Support, Dressing Room Supervisor, Registration table, etc.
- e) Hockey Calgary League Chair
- f) BVHS Tournament Support. For ex.: Swag bags, registration tables etc.
- g) BV Support Shifts – For ex: Hanging eval jerseys, sock/jersey nights, equipment pick-up and return.

Team Manager and Jersey Parent no longer qualify as positions to have their society-level volunteer bond covered. Each U9-U18 team is required to have two jersey parents to look after the respective jerseys.



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There is an official tracking process in volunteer local for society level volunteer hours and all hours will be logged and counted towards each family's total volunteer bond requirements.

TEAM LEVEL VOLUNTEERING

What is Team Level Volunteering?

Team Level Volunteering DOES NOT count towards your Society Level Volunteer Bond but it is still required to ensure a successful season for all the players on the team.

Team Level Volunteer Roles include the following:

- Manager
- 2 Jersey Parents (one for each set of jerseys)
- Treasurer
- Fundraising Coordinator
- Tournament Coordinator
- Social Events Coordinator
- Off Ice Officials (Penalty Box, Time Keeper and Score Keeper for games)
- Assisting with Team Tournaments

U7 & U18 JERSEY DEPOSIT

What is a jersey deposit?

Jersey deposits are required for the U7 and U18 age groups. We do not require a jersey deposit for the U9-U15 age groups. All jerseys are the property of BVHS and have required significant monetary investment to procure. As such, BVHS has the expectation that all teams use jersey parents (2 per team) and that under no circumstances will individual players be caring for their jerseys. If a jersey is destroyed, improperly handled, or not returned, BVHS reserves the right to assess a monetary penalty to the player/parent in question, which will be applied to that player's registration the following season. Please refer to the apparel policy for more details.

U7 families will be expected to care for their own player's jerseys throughout the season. U7 jerseys are generously loaned to our association by Hockey Calgary and are the property of Tim Horton's. All parents are expected to return the jersey at the end of the season in the same condition it was issued in. Failure to do so will require their credit card being charged the \$200 Jersey Bond commitment made during registration (dated April 15, 2027)

U18 players will have a \$200.00 jersey deposit commitment at time of registration (dated April 15, 2027). We still request our U18 teams utilize our jersey parent protocols. However, as many of these players are the age of majority, they may not have the same level of parental support.



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EQUIPMENT

What equipment does my player need?



Does the association supply practice jerseys and socks?

U7 will receive a "Timbit" jersey and a pair of socks. U9-U18 will receive 2 evaluation jerseys and 2 pairs of socks for evaluations.

U9 & U11 House will receive a pair of "Atomic" socks for games only.

Does the association supply goalie equipment?

All U9 teams are given a set of goalie equipment that the team can use for the season. You are responsible for supplying your own equipment for U11- U18.



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OFFICIATING

How to become a certified Official?

To become an official, you need to be a minimum of 13 years old and take part in an official's certification clinic. [Click here](#) for the Central Region Referees' Committee officiating website.

Who assigns the officials?

Referees/Linesmen for U13-U21 are assigned by CRRC Assignors.

What do you need to become an official?

Required Equipment:

- Black CSA certified helmet
- CSA certified half visor
- Elbow pads
- Metal or black plastic whistle
- Athletic support and cup
- Measuring tape
- Black polished skates with white laces
- Hockey Canada Rule Book
- Shin Pads
- Clean official's black and white sweater with Hockey AB crest on front left side and Hockey Canada on the left arm
- Black, pressed pants

*** Please note that a black Mesh Under Arm jersey is illegal

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COACHING

What is Shift Forward Coach/Team Official?

The Shift Forward Coach/Team Official program helps hockey coaches and youth leaders recognize, understand and respond to issues of bullying, abuse, harassment and discrimination. The Shift Forward Coach/Team Official is valid for 3 seasons.

Does every coach need to have Hockey Canada Safety Program – Level 1 certificate to be on the ice or bench?

Yes, every coach is required to valid Hockey Canada Safety Program – Level 1 to be on the ice or on the bench. This course will further educate our coaches and bring more confidence on the bench when it comes to injuries and is valid for 3 seasons.

Where can I check to see what coaching courses I need?

Depending on the age group and whether you are applying to be a head coach or assistant coach will vary on certifications. [Click here](#) to find out which qualifications are needed for the age group you would like to coach. **All certifications will need to be completed by November 15, 2026 to be added to the roster.**
